"As a small church we might only have thirty-five people in worship, but we have anywhere from fifty to a hundred views of the service on our Facebook page," Pastor Tim Engel replied when asked about social media and the church.

"The pandemic has led many churches to take advantage of the technology that we knew existed but never really used," he continued.

Engel's sermons have been posted on the congregation's website and *Messiah Houston* Facebook page for a number of years.

The live stream of the worship service, however, is a more recent addition to the church's outreach through social media. Engel acknowledges that he is a "digital immigrant" but has enjoyed learning about the current technologies. He admits, "All this is a far cry from the Apple IIc I purchased in 1986."

Despite so many concerns and controversies regarding social media, Engel still sees the benefits of Messiah's growing online presence.

"The movable type printing press allowed for the Reformation Movement to happen five hundred years ago. In the same way," Engel says, "God is calling His people to new ventures to bring the never-changing message of His love to an ever-changing world."

Messiah plans to live stream all its worship services for the foreseeable future.
