Messiah Modifies COVID Protocols

"By God's grace we were able to resume in–person worship in May of 2020," Pastor Tim Engel stated.

"Now, after a year without any coronavirus outbreaks in the congregation, we are comfortable modifying our COVID protocols."

The church will continue to practice social distancing by marking off every other pew. However, wearing a mask or face-covering will now be optional for worshipers.

"Many of our members have been vaccinated against the virus," Engel explained. "They are ready to take this step."

Engel further stated, "They also lived out their faith in God's promise of eternal life should they get sick and not survive the virus. They know that they would go to be with the Lord."

The decision to modify the congregation's protocols was made at the April Voters Meeting, based on the recommendation of the Church Council.

The decision by the voters was unanimous.

John and Pastor Tim's blood could very well save lives. That's important.


What is more important is that my Jesus shed His blood on the cross to save people for all eternity! Does it get any better than that?!?

As you read on Gabriel's newsletter page, last month we participated in a blood drive. As I looked at the setting for the blood drive, I thought, "We could do this at Messiah in our Fellowship Center."



After a phone call to the Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center, we set Saturday, June 5, as our date to host a blood drive.

We have three very good reasons to host a blood drive.

- 1) There is always a need for blood. Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center needs 1,000 donations every day of the year to serve patients in our community.
- 2) The blood drive will give our members and people in our community to save lives. **Red blood cells** are used to treat cancer, surgery, and trauma patients. **Plasma** often is needed to replace fluids in burn and trauma patients. **Platelets** help cancer and bone marrow transplant patients recover. Giving blood is one way to love our neighbors as ourselves.
- 3) We will have the opportunity to welcome our neighbors to our church and offer them our hospitality. Messiah is a church that cares about its neighborhood. We look for ways to be a benefit to the folks that live and work near us. This blood drive, along with our other outreach efforts, is part of our commitment to our neighborhood and beyond.

This month you will receive more information about the blood drive. Right now I ask that you mark the date, June 5, on your calendar. In addition to blood donors, we will need volunteers to greet people as they arrive, register them, and provide snacks for them after they donate.
