"Using the Bible Jesus Used"

"What the Old Testament conceals, the New Testament reveals."

That's what Pastor Tim Engel was taught more than thirty years ago in his seminary training.

It's a lesson that has stuck with him.

"I love preaching and teaching the Old Testament and finding out how a particular passage points us to Jesus," Engel often says.

Lately he has been putting that statement into practice in his preaching and teaching.

He calls it "using the Bible Jesus used."

"All of our New Testament theology and teaching comes from the Old Testament," Engel explained.

"Jesus and Paul couldn't quote from the Gospels or the Epistles. They hadn't been written yet. Everything they taught came from the Old Testament."


Engel credits the scholar Chad Bird for his renewed focus on the Old Testament.

Bird, a former professor at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana (and also a Texas native), has written a daily devotional book titled "Unveiling

Mercy" as well as the book "The Christ Key: Unlocking the Centrality of Christ in the Old Testament."



Both of these books open up the Old Testament and reveal the mercy of God which is made known to us in His Son, Jesus.



Engel stated, "I highly recommend both books for anyone who wants to deepen their understanding of the Old Testament, which, after all, makes up about three fourths of the Bible."

He continued, "I also intend to become more well-versed in the Old Testament so I can better teach and preach God's Word to His people."
