

SIT — take time to be with people instead of being in a hurry


LISTEN — your ears are kind of small compared to mine, but they can still hear people's hurts and sorrows

Dear Friends in Christ,

Greetings in the name of Jesus!

Early this month I will join other pastoral leaders of the Texas District at the Exponential 2024 Conference in Orlando, Florida.

I will focus on sessions that will help me equip you to be disciple-making disciples.

Jesus tells us in the last chapter of Matthew that we are to make disciples by baptizing and teaching.

The work of the church is to make disciples.

You are the church, so making disciples is your work.

This begins in the home, with your own children.

The responsibility of Christian parents is to raise their children to be disciples of Jesus Christ.

However, that's not where the job ends, with our own children.

The job continues as we live out our faith in the neighborhood and the work place, with friends, neighbors and coworkers.



It includes having spiritual conversations with people, especially in their times of need, to connect them to God through Jesus Christ.

It means saying to people, "That reminds me of a story about Jesus" or "That reminds me of a story Jesus told."

It means helping people to see how Jesus is messing with their lives to draw them to Him.

It means asking, "Would it be all right if I prayed with you?" and then praying out loud with people who are hurting in order to enlist the power of God for their needs.

All of this involves risk-taking and vulnerability on our part but opening up our hearts to others is the only way that the love of Jesus can flow from our heart to theirs.

I'm excited about this conference because it is a tremendous opportunity for me to learn new things that I can bring back to Messiah to help you become a disciple-making disciple.
