Then I was a special guest at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital Christmas Party. I got pets and snuggles from little kids as well as grown-ups. It was a great day!

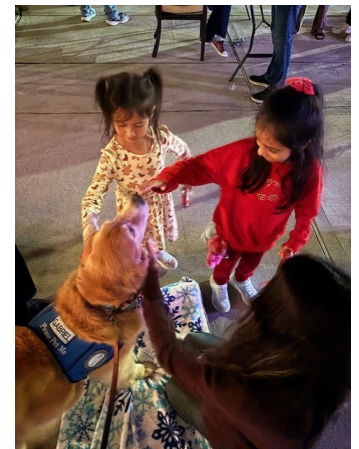

Dear friends in Christ,

This month marks my tenth anniversary at Messiah.

Many of you were members of the congregation when I was installed. Over the years, however, we have lost some very faithful members and have gained others.

In other words, some things have changed during the past decade.

Some of those changes were beyond our control, COVID being the most impactful. Hardest hit was our Early Childhood Center ministry. We have had to rebuild the staff as well as the enrollment. Our Director, Stacey Viviano, has worked very hard to do that and all indications are that we have turned the corner and are moving forward.

Other changes have been intentional. A week after my installation, the congregation voted to apply for a Comfort Dog. In the fall of 2017, Gabriel was placed with us and has opened up many doors for caring and out-reach ministries in our community and beyond.

God has provided other ministry opportunities for us during these past ten years. We have connected with our local firefighters and veterans by providing meals at Fire Station 11 and Camp Hope. We have also become a very welcome presence at Memorial Elementary School. Most recently, we have begun the after school Crossroads Kids Club, through which we can teach students about Jesus every Monday afternoon.

We have also launched a new disciple-making emphasis called "Followers Made" that meets weekly online. My hope is that I can lead this six month discipleship experience on an annual basis.

We have even remodeled two of our buildings to make them more useful, the Parish Hall that houses our Early Childhood Center and the Sunday School Building, which is now our much more functional Fellowship Center.

What does our Lord have in mind for Messiah in the coming ten years? Only He knows the answer to that question.

What He asks of us is that we have the **eyes** to see the opportunities He will present to us and the **faith** to seize those opportunities.

I look forward to discovering what God has in store for us at Messiah and the changes that He will bring about as we enter this new year.
